Women In Government (WIG) is excited to host the Future Women In Government leadership program at our 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Western Regional Conference taking place May 20, 2016 in Seattle, Washington.

The purpose of the program is to demonstrate hands-on leadership and mentoring for the next generation of women civic and political leaders. Impetus for this program came from the "Teach a Girl to Lead" project sponsored by the Center for American Women and Politics at Rutgers University and the goals of the White House Council on Women and Girls Leadership.
