Your resume should include:

- Your name and email address.
- Employment history and internships with your responsibilities for each position. If you are currently employed or hold an internship, include how many hours you work each week.
- Community or public service organizations in which you are active. Include how you participate in each organization.
- Honors and awards you have received.

UW Unofficial Transcript: Upload your unofficial transcript as a pdf

Access your UW unofficial transcript in <u>MyUW</u>. You do not need to include other transcripts.

REQUIRED ONLY FOR THE DUCK AND LEMIEUX SCHOLARSHIPS Prepare your answer to this question: The Duck and Lemieux scholarships are based on financial need. What would you like us to know about your financial situation for the 2023-24 academic year? Write a one-page personal statement and upload it as a pdf. Your name and the scholarship(s) you are applying for must be at the top of your statement. Questions to consider for your statement: How has financial need affected your ability to reach your educational goals? • Have you or your family faced hardships while you have been a student? What financial and academic successes have you had while at UW? How will a departmental scholarship make a difference for you personally as you complete your degree? How would receiving it enrich your UW education? • Are there any opportunities that the scholarship would give you that you would not otherwise have? • Additional information for the Duck Scholarship: This scholarship provides special consideration to applicants who have a demonstrated interest in environmental politics. If you are applying for the Duck scholarship, include information about your interest in environmental politics, if any, and how you engage with environmental issues.
