Admission to the Political Science Major

We accept applications to the Political Science major every quarter. Applications are linked to the departmental website <u>http://www.polisci.washington.edu/</u> and are due by the 2nd Sunday of the quarter. Students should apply to the major the first quarter in which they are eligible.

Minimum Admission Requirements:

- Three political science introductory courses (POL S 101, 201, 202, 203, 204 or 205), with completion of at least two courses and enrollment and attendance in the final course at the application deadline.
- Grades of at least 2.0 in each political science introductory course used for admission.
- 2.0 cumulative UW GPA or better.

Students who need extended premajor status or are already in a major and have circumstances like satisfactory progress issues may have additional requirements and should meet with a Pol S adviser

To apply to the major: Complete the online Political Science Major Application, accessible at <u>http://www.polisci.washington.edu/</u> and due by the 2nd Sunday of each quarter during the academic year. Applicants will be notified if they meet major entry requirements by the end of the 4th week of the quarter of admission.

Once admitted, to complete entry to the major:

- Attend a New Majors Information Session (sign-up information will be sent to the UW email address of all admitted students by the end of week 4—check your junk/spam folders or contact <u>polsadvc@uw.edu</u> if you do not receive that message).
- 2. After the information session, make an appointment if you would like to meet individually with a Political Science adviser.
